

Day 1 - Mexico City

Once you arrive at Mexico City International Airport, our representative will be waiting for you at the meeting point (references attached). Then, you will be transferred to the hotel, located downtown. After your check-in, you can enjoy of free time at the city center.

Day 2 - Mexico City - Teotihuacan - Guadalupe Shrine - City tour

On the second day we will depart to the archeological site of Teotihuacan. His Aztec name means "the place where gods were born" and is one of the most visited archaeological sites in the world, where it's possible to enjoy the view of impressive pyramids "of the Sun" and "of the Moon".

Later, you'll discover the world-famous Nuestra Senora de Guadalupe Church. In the afternoon enjoy a City Tour visiting the historic center of Mexico City, with his "Zocalo" (also known as Plaza de la Constitución), the Nacional Palace (residence of the nation President) and the Metropolitan Cathedral, the largest Cathedral of the Americas. At the end, we will head back to the hotel where you can spend free time enjoying a walk or shopping downtown.

Day 3 – Mexico City – Taxco - Puebla

After having breakfast at the hotel you will depart to Taxco, located in the Guerrero Estate, which became one of the most important mining areas in the empire of New Spain. Today it is also known as the Silver City, and in almost every corner of the town, you can find stores where locally produced silver jewelry is sold. Later we will continue our way to Puebla for accommodations at the reserved hotel.

Day 4 - Puebla - Cholula - Oaxaca

After breakfast, you'll spend the entire morning visiting the most important places of Puebla and Cholula, a little Mexican traditional district, located in the metropolitan areas. Among them there is the baroque Cathedral, the main square, the church of Santo

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Domingo and the Great Pyramid, which look like a natural hill, surmounted by the church of Nuestra Señora de los Remedios. The colonial architecture of Puebla is defined by its heavy use of ornamental tiles called Talavera. That makes its buildings more colorful than most of their contemporaries in other parts of Mexico. Afterword Continue on to the city of Oaxaca, where accommodation will be in a downtown hotel.

Day 5 - Monte Alban - Mitla - City Tour Oaxaca

On this day, prepare yourself to enjoy a guided tour of Monte Alban archaeological site, the most majestic of Oaxaca's ancient ruins. Its name means "White Mountain," and is an ancient Zapotec capital and archaeological site, having a spectacular mountain top location overlooking the valleys of Oaxaca. It is one of the culturally and historically significant places to visit in Mexico and received the UNESCO World Heritage Site designation in 1987. After that, we will be visiting Mitla, an archaeological site located just a few miles southeast of Oaxaca city, considered one of the most important places to visit the área. Designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2010, Mitla was once an important Zapotec religious and ceremonial center. Here you'll find a series of structures and patios adorned in stonework mosaics. These ancient cut-stone mosaics, created by fitting together thousands of polished cut stones, are believed to date back to the last two or three centuries before the arrival of the Spanish. Once back to Oaxaca, you'll be visiting the historic center, with his Cathedral, the fountain of the Seven Regions, Santo Domingo Church and the "Gold's Museum".

Day 6 - Oaxaca - Tuxtla - Sumidero Canyon - San Cristobal de las Casas

Transfer to the airport of Oaxaca and departure with domestic flight to Tuxtla Gutierrez. On arrival you'll enjoy a guided tour visiting the Sumidero Canyon, a protected area at the Federal level since 1980, is a magnificent geological landscape located in central depression of the State. Here, granite cliffs and walls with a height of over a thousand meters surround the cause of the Grijalva River.

Later we'll discover a small village in Chapa de Corzo where you will learn more about the Mayan culture. In the afternoon we will continue on to San Cristobal de las Casas to checkin at the hotel located downtown.









Day 7 - San Cristobal - Zinacatan and Chamula - San Cristobal

After breakfast at the hotel, join a city tour in San Cristobal de las Casas, visiting the Santo Domingo church and a typical local market. Later on discover the native community of Zinacatan and San Juan Chamula.

Day 8 – San Cristobal - Agua Azul Falls - Palenque

Early morning you will depart to the spectacular Agua Azul falls, the most fascinating area in the mountains located between Palenque and Ocosingo. It consists of many cataracts following one after another in the Cascadas de Agua Azul Natural Park. The larger cataracts may be about 6 meters (20 ft.) high. At the end of the visit, we will move toward Palenque, a little town at the bottom of the mountains, famous for the homonym archaeological site. Accomposition at the hotel and free afternoon time to visit the town.

Day 9 - Palenque - Campeche

On the ninth day you will be amazed with the famous archeological site of Palenque. Here you'll be confronted by the largest Mesoamerican step pyramid, the Temple of Inscriptions, spotted with hieroglyphics that have contributed significantly to the study of Mayan civilization. Later on we will depart to Campeche to the hotel located downtown.

Day 10 – Campeche – Kabah and Uxmal - Merida

After having breakfast at the hotel you will enjoy a guided city tour in Campeche visiting the city's key places to discover more about their history. Later on you will be transferred to the archeological sites of Uxmal and Kabah. Continue to Merida in the afternoon for hotel accommodations.

Day 11 – Merida - Chichen Itza - Playa del Carmen

Prepare yourself to visit one of the Seven Wonders of the World: Chichen Itza. Absolutely the most visited archaeological site in the peninsula of Yucatan, due to its extraordinary architecture beauty and its geographical location, Chichen Itza was one of the greatest



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Mayan centers of the Yucatán peninsula. The fusion of mayan centers construction techniques with new elements from central Mexico make Chichen Itza one of the most important examples of the Mayan - Toltec civilization in Yucatan. Several buildings have survived, such as the Warriors' Temple "El Castillo" and the circular observatory known as "El Caracol"

Later you will be departing to Playa del Carmen to the hotel of your preference.

The package includes:

- 1 night at Hotel El Castellano 4*(or similar) of Merida breakfast included.

The package does not include:
